People evaluate the pros and cons of medical treatments in very personal ways. This explains why some people choose a treatment and others reject it. A big question is, how much would you be willing to endure if the chance of regaining your current health was high? What if the chance was low? - Imagine that you are seriously ill. The doctors are recommending treatment for your illness, but the treatments have **very severe side effects, such as severe pain, nausea, vomiting, or weakness that could last for months.**
